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Topic: New Jersey Assigned Risk Automobile Class Coding Revision
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The New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance has approved the coverage for Autocycles.

“Autocycle” means a three-wheeled motorcycle designed to be controlled with a steering wheel and pedals in which the operator and passenger may ride in a completely or partially enclosed seating area that is equipped with a roll cage or roll hoops, safety seat belts for each occupant, and anti-lock brakes.

This new coding is applicable to policies effective February 1, 2018 for new and renewal policies.

Pedestrian PIP coverage does not apply to autocycles.

The attached coding on page 73 is reflected in the Assigned Risk Automobile Statistical Plan.
